Wear Red


In celebration of Pentecost Sunday, everyone is encouraged to wear red on Sunday, May 19. This will also be the day for celebrating our graduating high school seniors.

Net Gain/Loss: \$ 4,236.41

Water is Life - Well Project



Malawi's population is 18.6 million. More than 50% of the population is under 18 years old. 1 in 3 people don't have clean water to drink. Deep-drilled wells can provide clean water for thousands of people in a single area. Solar well designs can withstand more effects of climate change and extreme weather disasters.

Noisy Offering

In response to the synod's recent visit to Malawi. and in light of the effects of climate change on weather. health. and agriculture there, the bishop is inviting the people. congregations, and friends of the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin to partner with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi in the building of 2 new solar-powered, deep drilled borehole wells. The goal is to raise \$40.000 by June 2024.





Just Because Meals

Sometimes we want to help someone who might be struggling with health or other issues, but we don't know exactly how to approach the situation. Our Saviour's has organized something called "Just Because" ministry. We use a website called "Take Them a Meal"

which allows volunteers to sign up to bring a meal to someone who would appreciate it. Jared checks with the family to learn preferences and allergies. Then he emails everyone on the volunteer list and people sign up to take a meal (homemade or takeout). Sometimes two people do it together. Often it's not only the food that is uplifting to a family, but also the opportunity to visit for a few minutes when the food is dropped off.

World Relief is looking for teams of 6-10 people to partner with new refugee families for the first 6 months of their arrival. "A Good Neighbor Team (GNT) is a small group of people from a local church that partners with World Relief to welcome, walk alongside, and offer long-term reciprocal friendships with a newly arrived refugee family." Most families are expected to find housing within the city of Eau Claire due to the public transportation that is available there. At this time, refugees are most likely to be from the Democratic Republic of Congo and Myanmar/Burma and arrive sometime between now and September. Please let Deacon Kari know if you are interested, so we can determine if there is sufficient interest to form a team.

many times can we fill the tube. Let's find out!! We will keep you posted!!


The tube will be available during regular services during May and it will move on the last Sunday of the month to the Park. It will also be available in the office during the week.

Then in July I will send out the August Newsletter at its regular time.



You may recall from the history of OSLC, the original windows in the sanctuary were to be temporary and eventually replaced with real stained glass windows. Thanks to many donations and contributors, we did upgrade the windows to clear, energy efficient windows with the idea that stained glass inserts could beautify the sanctuary and provide the stories through glass art as potential for spiritual nourishment for all ages.

A successful work of this committee will be designs that represent our church community. We will be having open conversation during the middle hour on May 5th to share what we have learned, ideas that we've considered, and to listen to your cares and concerns about this project as we move forward. This is not a church-funded or budgeted project, but an opportunity to share gifts in memory of, in honor of or anonymously and therefore will be a process over time. 
