Stir up, your power, Lord Christ, and come. . . .

With these words, we will begin the season of Advent at the end of this month. Throughout the season, in each Sunday's prayer of the day, listen for this plea for God to stir up power while God also stirs up our hearts and stirs up our wills as part of leading us into a future filled with promise and hope.

When I bake, I stir up the ingredients so that something wonderful can come out of the oven. Stirring up a big pot of homemade soup sends out tantalizing aromas that can fill us with anticipation. And yet, when we speak of someone stirring up the pot, we may not intend it as a compliment.

To many of us "stirring up the pot" implies causing trouble and challenging the norms, and when we think about it, that's precisely what Jesus did throughout his ministry - he stirred up good, holy trouble, as Jesus invited his followers to live in contrast to the prevailing ways of the world.

Even before Jesus' birth, we will catch glimpses of how Jesus will stir the pot. John the Baptist will call for us to repent as an act of preparation for Jesus' coming, and Mary will sing of great reversals where the mighty are brought down and the lowly are uplifted.

Lest you be caught off guard, be alerted that our congregation is choosing to start the season of Advent one week early. Rather than celebrate the 4th Sunday of Advent in the morning and Christmas Eve later in the day, we are choosing to shift the start of Advent to Nov. 26 which puts the fourth Sunday of Advent on Dec. 17. There will be no morning worship on Dec. 24, though there will be three options for Christmas Eve worship at 2, 4 & 10 p.m.






Volunteer Opportunities





This fundraiser was quite successful as the auction brought in \$2331.00 in bids and donations, which means we were able to split the total, sending \$1165.50 each to Mission Mexico and to the congregation we support in Malawi.
